

## Contractor—Specific Information

If your work involves higher risk activities such as working at height, electrical work, hot work, etc you may be required to obtain a permit to work from Facilities Management. To ensure that permits are issued appropriately, discuss the health and safety aspects of your work with your contact person within Facilities Management.

Smoking, the use of flame, naked lights or the application of heat as in welding or burning is prohibited in all University buildings. The contractor must seek permission before commencing these activities from the Project Officer controlling the work.

Contractors will be expected to follow relevant method statements or safe systems of work. You should also advise Facilities Management if your work is likely to disturb any hidden services.

Additionally, contractors and their employees must familiarise themselves with actions to be taken in the event of fire including how to raise the alarm, location of the nearest fire alarm call point, means of escape from their work area and the location of fire fighting equipment.

Any contractor working on University premises:

- **Must not** obstruct means of escape routes
- **Must not** wedge open fire doors
- **Must not** disable detectors, isolate zones or tamper with any fire alarm system
- **Must not** remove fire extinguishers
- **Must not** carry out their work in such a way as to pose a risk to the health and safety of others.

Asbestos is not present in the campus.

All contractors are expected to report any defective plant, unsafe practices or unsafe methods of work to Facilities Management.



### Moving Around Campus

Please take care when moving around campus.

Ensure that:


- You stick to the speed limit

# Health and Safety Information for Visitors and Contractors

The University is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for its staff, students and visitors. However brief your visit to campus might be, we want to ensure that your time with us is a safe one and that you know what to do if you need help or assistance in an emergency. This leaflet will provide you with the basic information. Full policies and procedures are available on request, or by contacting the Health, Safety and Environment Section on (00357) 24694123.

## Fire Safety

The University has various systems in place to manage fire safety. It is therefore important that you are aware of what to do if you discover a fire or hear the fire alarm.

### What to do if you discover a fire:

- Immediately operate the nearest fire alarm call point
- From a place of safety dial **97885888**
- Evacuate to the assembly point which is noted on the blue fire action notices displayed at the fire alarm call points

### What to do if you discover a fire:

- Leave the building by the nearest available exit closing doors behind you
- Do not stop to collect personal belongings
- Do not use lifts
- Evacuate to the assembly point (Main Car Parking Area)



The fire alarms are tested on a weekly basis and signs detailing the day and time are displayed at building entrances. During such tests the alarm should sound for no longer than 10 seconds.

## First Aid

The first aider can be summoned by dialling one of the following numbers using any internal telephone:

- **97 885888** University Emergency number
- **4060** Security
- Any first aider where details are noted on signs displayed within the University buildings.

If you have any medical condition that you think we should be aware of please advise the person you are meeting.

## Incident Reporting

All incidents must be reported even if you do not sustain a personal injury or it is a near miss incident. Accident/Incident report forms can be obtained from Security, reception areas, the responsible person within the area you are visiting.

Alternatively you can contact the Health, Safety and Environment Section on (00357) 24694123. These forms must be fully completed with all relevant contact/personal details.

## Any other emergency

In the case of any emergency where you require the Police, an ambulance, or Security please dial **97885888** and state the nature of the emergency so that the University may respond appropriately.

## Safety Signs and Signals

Whilst you are on campus it is important that you are aware of the different types of safety signs. Examples of some of the most important ones may be found below:

### PROHIBITION SIGN



Red and white circles are representing something you must **NOT** do.

### WARNING



Yellow and black triangles warning of a danger.

### MANDATORY



Blue and white circles represent something you **MUST** do.

### EMERGENCY



Green and white rectangles provide emergency information and usually lead to a place of safety.
